



OBITUARY

PROFESSOR K.B. POWAR



(December 20, 1937–February, 2014)

Professor Krishnapratap Bhagwantrao Powar breathed his last after a prolonged illness and suffering from cancer at 3.30 pm on February 22nd, 2016 in the Dr. D.Y. Patil deemed University Hospital at Pune. He was working as a Chancellor of Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical University, Pimpri, Pune and had adorned several positions such as Secretary General of Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi; Vice-Chancellor of Shivaji University, Kolhapur and Head of the Department of Geology, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. The family members, his associates, colleagues, students and friends were grieved in his sad demise that created void in the field of geosciences and the higher education in India. Just 20 days before his demise, his wife Jyoti Pawar also passed away due to prolonged illness. The couple is survived by their son, Dr. Sanjay Pawar and daughter, Monika Pawar-Patil.

Professor Powar was born on December 20, 1937 and had his higher education at the Nagpur University, Nagpur from where he obtained his B.Sc. in 1958 and M.Sc. degree in Applied Geology in 1960 and was awarded the J.P. Trivedi Gold Medal and the King Edward Memorial Scholarship. He later moved to Banaras Hindu University (BHU), Varanasi and obtained his Ph.D. degree in Geology in 1967. Subsequently, he received the Fulbright and Institute of International Education awards for higher studies and research in the U.S. during 1966-67.

Professor Powar was an exceptionally good teacher, great researcher and a perfect educational administrator in his professional career of 44 years. His career as a Lecturer in Geology started at Banaras Hindu University where he served during 1960-69. He then joined as a Reader in Geology at Poona University (1969-77) and became Professor of Geology, Poona University (1977-86) before being appointed as Vice Chancellor, Shivaji University, Kolhapur in September 1986. He was reappointed as a Vice-Chancellor in September 1989 and completed his term as a Vice-Chancellor in 1992. He then was appointed as Secretary General, Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi in February 1993 and was reappointed for a second term of five years in February, 1998. He retired from the AIU in December 2002 and thereafter worked as the Founder Director of the Amity Foundation for Higher Learning, New Delhi till November 2004. Later, he was Advisor to the Vice Chancellor D.Y. Patel Vidyapeeth (Deemed University), Pune and became the Chancellor of the same University until his death.

Professor Powar made varied and significant research contributions in the field of Geology. His important contributions relate to the geology of the Kumaun and Ladakh Himalaya; and geology of the Deccan Volcanic Province. He successfully guided 22 research students for their Ph.D degrees in the Earth Sciences, published 82 research papers, edited 3 research volumes and authored 4 textbooks in Geology. In recognition of his research work, he was elected as Fellow of the Geological Society of India (1966), Fellow of Maharashtra Academy of Sciences (1994) and Fellow of the National Academy of Sciences, India (1988). He was elected President of the Geology and Geography Section of the Indian Science Congress Association (1986-87). He was Vice President, Maharashtra Academy of Science (1991-94). He was elected the first Life Fellow of the Mineralogical Society of India, in 2006, for his overall contributions to mineralogy and petrology. He was awarded the G-51 Millennium Award by the World Environment Congress and others in 1998. Two *festschriften* - *Contributions to Environmental Sciences* (2000) and *Geoindicators and Related Environmental Studies* (2002) - have been published in his honour.

Professor Powar was widely known for his contributions to research and policy planning related to higher education, especially in the areas of quality assurance, economics of education, internationalization of higher education and governance of higher education institutions. In this area, he published 64 papers, authored 6 books and edited 17 volumes dealing with different aspects of higher education besides guiding one Ph.D. student in the field of distance higher education. The books authored by him include, '*Accreditation in Higher Education: The Indian Perspective*' (1996), *Performance Indicators in Distance Higher Education* (2000), '*Indian Higher Education: A Conglomerate of Concepts, Facts and Practices*' (2002), *Internationalisation of Higher Education: focus on India*' (2003), '*Quality of Higher Education*' (2005) and '*Reflections*' based on his experience in governance in higher education institutions.

Professor Powar was a member, Board of Management of the Geological Survey of India (1984-87), Chairman of the National Committee for International Union of Geological Sciences (1988-91) and President, and Chairman, Governing Body of Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, Dehra Dun (1991-97). He was Convenor of the Earth Sciences Panel of the University Grants Commission, member of the Executive Committee and the Council of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, member of the Governing Body of the Sports Authority of India and member of the Board of Control for Cricket in India.

Professor Powar's charismatic style of functioning, unpretentious approach and humanitarian values held him in high esteem and made him popular and respectable in society and academic circle. His gracious and formal behavior reflected his qualities as a teacher and researcher that can be emulated by all of us. Before his death, though he was suffering from cancer, he never stopped his fervour for writing and completed his last book '*Reflections*', while he was in hospital and in a condition where he was unable to hold a pen and paper in his hand. He simply gave dictations to complete the book. A magnificent teacher, gleaming researcher, impeccable educational administrator and venerable human being, Professor K.B. Powar will be fondly remembered by all his friends, students and colleagues for his contributions to geology and higher education in India.

On May 15, 2016 delegates assembled at Hotel Xiyuan for registration. The meeting was held on May 16, 2016 at IVPP at 9 A.M. under the Chairmanship of Dr. Lars Holmer. Dr. Zhonghe Zhou, President IPA welcomed the delegates and introduced main topics of the business meeting. Dr. Lars Holmer presented the budget report on behalf of Dr. Ron Parsley, Treasurer of IPA, who could not come. Dr. Hiroshi Katazato suggested about how to enhance connection of IPA with IVGS and IVBS in order to make IPA more effective and visible among palaeontologists in the world.

Dr. Thomas Servais gave suggestions on connection between IPA and affiliated palaeontological organizations; later on the meeting discussed the establishment of fellows of IPA and other honours or prizes of the organization.

In the afternoon session, which was chaired by Dr. James Crampton, Dr. Jere Lipps made presentation on palaeoparks project initiative. A detailed discussion was held on how to make the project play a bigger role in promoting the conservation of

important fossil sites and raising public awareness about the significance of the fossil conservation. Dr. Lipps suggested observing the International Fossil Day every year sometime in the Second week of October. Prof. M.P. Singh made a presentation on the activities of the Palaeontological Society of India and efforts being made to popularise palaeontology in India.

Dr. Yougdong Wang apprised members on the progress of the website of IPA. He invited suggestions from the members for its improvement. Lastly, discussion was held on how to expand the number of membership of the IPA and how to improve its official web pages and possibility of the selection of the annual 10 palaeontological discoveries or break through of IPA.

The Morning session on 17th May, 2016 was chaired by Dr. Zhonghe Zhou. Dr. Eric Buffetaut made presentation on the organization of the next International Palaeontological congress at Paris from July 9th to July 13th 2018. The meeting deliberated on the issues of the next IPC. Dr. Zhou initiated discussion on the establishment of special committees of honours, prizes and other missions.

In the post-lunch session, an excursion was arranged to Zhoukoudian, a famous *Homo erectus* site.

A very warm welcome to you all at the 60th Annual General Body Meeting of your Society. I am happy to present a brief annual report of the activities of the Society for the year 2015-16.

Annual General Meeting

The 59th Annual General Body Meeting of the Society was held on 2nd March 2015 under the chairmanship of Prof. Ashok Sahni. Thirty-eight fellows attended the meeting. The Annual Report of the Society was presented by the Secretary and audited account for the year 2013-14 placed by the Treasurer before the members. These were approved.

Council Meetings

The Executive Council of the Society met on seven occasions during the preceding year for transacting the routine business of the Society.

Lectures

1. 33rd M.R. Sahni Lecture was delivered on 2nd March 2015 by **Dr. Franz T. Fursich, Emeritus Professor, University of Erlangen – Nuremberg, Germany** on “**Shell concentrations: a tool for palaeoecological and palaeoenvironmental reconstructions**”.
2. 17th Prof. S.N. Singh Memorial Lecture was delivered by **Mr. N.K. Verma, M.D. and C.E.O., O.N.G.C., Videsh** on 24th September, 2015, on a topic entitled “**Challenges and opportunities for global E & P business under price regime**”
3. **Dr. O.N. Bhargava, F.N.A.** was the Speaker of 3rd Prof. R.C. Misra Memorial Lecture held on 23rd November 2015. He spoke on “**Unique Geological Heritage Features and Geotourism**”.

Awards

1. **M.R. Sahni Memorial Gold Medal** was awarded to Ms. Komal Singh for securing the highest marks in Palaeontology at 3rd & 4th Semesters’(Combined) examinations of 2015 of University of Lucknow.
2. **Prof. R.C. Misra Memorial Lifetime Achievement Award** for the year 2015 was conferred on **Dr. O.N. Bhargava, F.N.A.**
3. **Prof. S.K. Singh Memorial Gold Medal** for the best paper published in the Journal of the Palaeontological Society of India during the year 2015, was awarded to Dr. Mohan Nagasundaram of G.S.I., Kolkata for the paper entitled, “Middle Holocene phytolith record from a marine sediment core, off Land fall Island, North Andaman : an indicator for understanding SW Monsoon variations” (*Journal of the Palaeontological Society of India*, vol.59 (2), pp. 181-192, 2014).

5. **Mani Shanker Shukla Memorial Gold Medal** for the year 2014, was awarded to Dr. Pawan Govil, Scientist C, of B.S.I.P., Lucknow for his outstanding contribution to micropalaeontology (below 35 years).

Prof. M.P. Singh, Secretary of the Society, delivered the Presidential address at 25th Indian Colloquium of Micropalaeontology and Stratigraphy on “**Future of Palaeontology in India**” on 18th December, 2015 at Aurangabad.

Dr. V.P. Misra, Vice President of the Society, represented the Society at the meeting of Federation of Indian GeoScience Association at Goa. He spoke on “Shaping the future of Earth Science Education in India. FIGA organised a conference on “GeoSciences for the future : an Indian perception”.


