### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2007-08

The last Annual General Meeting of the society was held on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2008 at the centre of Advanced Study in Geology, Lucknow University, under the chairmanship of Prof. B.S. Tewari, the President of the society. Forty Fellows attended the meeting. Prof. M.P. Singh, the Secretary read the notice of the meeting followed by the presentation of the Annual Report. The Secretary apprised fellows regarding efforts being made to procure financial assistance from different Governmental and other funding agencies. Dr. Mukund Sharma suggested to explore the possibility of speedy publication of significant findings of academic importance in the journal of the society. Matter was referred to the Editors for the follow up action. Dr.V.P. Misra, the Joint Secretary, Palaeontological Society of India suggested that there is an urgent need of revision of the society's Directory as many addresses and phone numbers of fellows have changed. The Audited Statement of Accounts for the year 2007-08 was presented by Prof. S. Kumar, Treasurer of the society. As there were no comments, the Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts were adopted.

10<sup>th</sup> S.N. Singh Memorial Lecture was delivered by Dr. K. Ayyasami, Director (Technical), Department of Mines, Ministry of Mines, Govt. of India, New Delhi. He spoke on, "Faunal Succession and ammonite Biostratigraphy of the Cretaceous Rocks of Ariyalur area, Tamil Nadu".

Dr. S. Mukherjee, Director, Geological Survey of India, Faridabad gave a talk on "Antarctica".

Besides this, the scientists from N.G.R.I., O.N.G.C., G.S.I.,

W.I.H.G. also visited the society and interacted with the fellows of the Society.

### M.R. SAHNI GOLD MEDAL

Last year, M.R. Sahni Memorial Gold Medal sponsored by the Palaeontological society of India was awarded to Mr. Gaurav Singh for securing highest percentage of marks in Palaeontology Paper at M.Sc. (2008) examination of the Lucknow University.

For outstanding contribution in the field of micropalaeontology, Prof. S. N. Bhalla Gold Medal has been awarded to Dr. Anil Bhandari, General Manager (Geology), Forward Base Manager, O.N.G.C., Silchar (Assam).
